





- 3. Health Care Centers, Wellness centers





National Update AWCs

ICDS APIP 2020-21 Priorities

- **1.Swachhata Action Plan:** Construction of Toilets & Drinking water facilities in AWCs to be completed by March, 2021.
- 2.Leveraging funds for toilet & drinking water facilities through convergence (CSR, Swachh Bharat Kosh, Gram Panchayat funds (FFC, SFC), Tribal Affairs, MPLADS/MLALADS, Aspiration districts (NITI Ayog)
- 3. **Training** (AWWs, AWHs, supervisors, CDPOs etc.) as per revised guidelines 2017, in virtual training mode
- **4.3000 toilets** (Telangana- under APIP)
- **5."State of Art model AWCs"** under Smart City Area (Belgaum, Tumkur and Bangalore district, Karnataka)


- AWCs may be resumed outside containment Zone

- 3. Cleanliness, hygiene, sanitation to be ensured around AWCs
- 4. Mask/ face cover mandatary
- 5. Frequent handwashing, strict social distancing
- **6. ICE and messages** on COVID prevention
- **7. 5-8 children on any** day (weekly once)
- 8. Protocols after CORONA patient identification
- 9. Community based event in small group (protocols)





3- Challenges & Opportunities for WASH in schools





Adequacy, O&M of WASH, a major challenge:


Recent CAG report) India, 2019:

- 27% with challenges of separate toilet
- > 30 % cases toilets not in use
- > 72% without running water facility in toilet
- > 55% of toilets no hand washing facility
- > 75 % toilets not maintained hygienically

- Capacities on WASH, IPC in schools (incl. MHM)-Teachers - School/residential schools/ hostel, SMCs, sanitary/cleaning Workers
- 2. SVP Benchmarking based school led "SAP"
- 3. Leveraging **resources through convergence** (panchayat-FFC, ULBs, CSR etc), piped water supply)
- 4. Robust O&M (dedicated fund), hygiene, cleaning
- 5. Effective review, monitoring (MIS)
- 6. Age appropriate WASH in curriculum, IEC, SBCC
- 7. Support **roll out of SHP in state** (aspiration dist.)
- 8. Strengthening— Child Cabinet, club, peer educator
- 9. Focus on inclusive, climate resilient, adequate WASH provisions incl. handwashing facilities
- **10.Safe Disposal (**faecal, waste, used sanitary pad)
- 11. Ensuring **supplies** (soap, pads, disinfectant),
- 12. Building strong community linkages, ownership

Challenges & Opportunities for WASH in AWCs

AWC's with WASH facilities (Dec 2019, Status, total 13.77 lakhs AWCs)





- Huge access gaps
- 27.6% ,3.77lakh AWCs are functioning in rented premises
- Child friendliness, O&M, concerns (with handwashing)
- Closure due to COVID pandemic has impacted functionality
- WASH, IPC skills of frontline workers, children, caregiver (COVID 19)

- 1. Integrated Child friendly WASH in AWC:-"Swachata Action Plan" Plan/ Costed WASH in AWC" for gap identification, (policies)
- 2. Establishing/ upgrading to child friendly, climate resilient, inclusive WASH provisions (with BaLA, including handwashing facility)
- 3. Promoting piped water supply availability
- **4. Leveraging resources (convergence)** for strengthening **WASH in AWC provisions (**As from Panchayat (FFC, MGNREGA), CSR etc)
- **5. WASH & IPC capacities** of **front line workers** (COVID 19)- virtual training/ orientation
- 6. Monitoring of **WASH indicators in ICDS/Poshaan MIS**
- 7. IEC/ BCC activities at AWC level
- 8. Ensuring essential supplies (soap, disinfectant)

- 1. Addressing WASH Gaps adequacy, user friendly design (inclusive, female users)
- 2. Disparity in **functionality, O&M** of WASH in facilities especially in hard to reach/remote areas
- 3. Lack of **dedicated fund availability-** WASH/ IPC (Convergence). At time concerned offcials may not be aware of funding provisions despite sufficient funds.
- 4. Practice of hand hygiene at critical 5 moments, variation of risk perception among different cadre for handwashing
- 5. Contractual **modalities for cleanliness, laundry services and bio medical waste management services** to ensure round the clock services
- **6. Availability of essential consumables like soaps, disinfectant,** cleaning material, PPE, waste bins/trolleys
- 7. WASH & IPC capacities/ skills of concern staff, stakeholders, cleaning service providers (COVID 19) service provides
- 8. Lack of frequent monitoring/ use of data for WASH for facility level improvement planning
- 9. Community responsibility for WASH, IPC in HCF's

Cleanliness & nyglenic surroungings, visible parameters for patients/ visitors to judge quality care

Key Opportunities and next steps for WASH in HCFs programs

- Prizes under Kayakalp, LaQshya, NQAS certification (specific Action Plan) to help prioritize WASH in HCF programs
- 2. COVID sensitive(No/Low hand touch/foot operated) handwash units, Touch free hand sanitiser system
- 3. Technical SOPs, guidance note, training module (COVID 19) can be used even after the COVID pandemic
- 4. Frequent monitoring and supportive supervision of HCF's once they start implementation of the FiPs
- 5. Developing strong community ownership- Swachhatta Diwas/ Audit
- **6. IEC package/ BCC strategy, posters,** films, special day observation due to COVID can be continued even after the pandemic
- 7. Stakeholder department convergence for leveraging resources (Rogi Kalyan Samitis, Panchayats, ULBs, VHSNC)
- **8. Documentation of performance improvement** in services (water, sanitation, hygiene, IPC, waste mgt., env. Cleaning) for scale up

4- Way Forward

- 1. Gap assessment of WASH in HCF to inform facility led planning, implementation & mgt.(SAP, FIP) and a robust internal monitoring for program implementation.
- 2. Prioritizing WASH & IPC provision as per norms
- 3. Capacity building/sensitization & refreshers (clear roles, responsibilities, protocols)
- 4. Robust supply plan to ensure adequate supply of cleanling material, waste bins
- 5. Ensure good contractual modality for sanitary workers, bio medical waste, pantry, laundry services to eliminate risk of disruptions
- 6. Robust O&M of WASH mgmt. systems facilities in Institutions
- **7. Convergence/ coordination/ leveraging resources for** piped water connection, sewerage management
- 8. Promoting innovations, awards, recognition,
- 9. Frequent documentation and dissemination of success for cross learning
- 10. Developing community ownership for sustained, climate resilient WASH-in Institutions

2- National Update: Schools, PAB, 2020-21

- 1- School Safety & Security (COVID 19): can prioritized "WASH, Infection control, "MHM"
- a. Orientation programme for teacher in safety and security in schools, with support for school safety.
- Funding under community mobilization & SMC trainings may be utilized for awareness of – parents, SMCs, students on COVID 19 (with role clarity)
- c. Programme Mgt. (MMER)/ Composites School grant funds may support thermal scanning facility

2- Composite School Grant (SAP):

- a. 10% to be utilized as "Swachhata Action Plan (SAP)"
- b. Sanitization & disinfections, airflow in indoor spaces
- c. WASH facilities provision incl. handwashing facilities
- d. Essentials like- soaps, disinfectant and cleaning material
- **3- Maintenance head** of residential schools/ hostel
- may prioritized for WASH supplies

4- School health programme (SHP):

- a. 1 sessions per with, possible integration in curriculum, timetable may also include WASH behaviours
- b. 2 teachers (preferably 1 male and 1 female) to be designated as "Health and Wellness Ambassadors"
- c. Students as health and wellness messengers

- **5- Equity Provisions:** MHM can be effectively addressed under
- a. 628 Incinerators as special project for equity, Telangana
- b. "Adolescent Programme for girls" AP, Karnataka, Telangana,
- **6- Specific initiatives (Andhra Pradesh):** "WASH behaviour change" can be effectively addressed through
- a. "Youth / Eco Club in schools" Andhra Pradesh, Telangana
- b. "Vidyarthi Vikasam" (Child's Holistic Development)"-
