



E-repository on Gender Responsive Governance (GRG) for Knowledge and Information Sharing

The National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj in collaboration UN Women, India implemented a Project entitled, "From Opportunities to Capacities: A Multi-Sectoral Approach to Enhancing Gender Responsive Governance in India" from October 2016 to March 2018. This e-repository putting together existing resources and materials on gender and governance in India, is an output of the project. It is a limited but unique attempt to archive, visibilise and increase access to the existing knowledge base and expertise in the field of Gender Responsive Local Governance with specific focus on India. We are grateful to Women Power Connect, a Women's Organization in New Delhi for supporting us in this work.

This e-repository contains information on NGOs working in the area of GRG (Registered NGOs) with their complete contact detail; List of Research Centres and Training Institutes which work in the area of GRG (Registered Centres and Training Institutes) with their complete contact details; Contact details of Key Resource Persons in Local Governance with an expertise in Gender; Training manuals and handbooks on GRG; Research outputs in GRG in the form of journal articles, reports and Policy briefs; Learning material (audio-visual) in GRG and data on Gender responsive Governance.

The e-repository contains mainly links and some full texts (depending on whether the information generating organization has made it freely accessible through the World Wide Web). The list of experts is limited to who consented to be represented in this specific archive. The organizations and institutions are not exhaustive and based on internet search followed by verification and expression of interest to be part of the archive. The specific methods of building the archive have been enumerated in the following sections but it is important to mention that the archive does not claim to be exhaustive. Rather, it is a dynamic one—one in making- which we hope, in time, will be collectively owned, developed and used by different organizations, institutions and individuals working on gender and local governance.

Following is a methodology of how the information in the E Repository was compiled.





Methodology:

2. List of NGOs working in the area of GRG (Registered NGOs) with their complete contact details:

A master list of nongovernmental organizations, research and training organizations was primarily created through desk based research. For this reason, most of the organisations mentioned in this repository have websites or information about their work available online. Additionally, a snowballing technique, wherein organisations referred other organisations working on GRG was undertaken.

The contact details (address, contact number and email id) of the organizations on the list were then verified through telephonic interviews. Information pertaining to the issues NGOs work on, constituencies they work with, their area of operation and strategies they deploy has been sourced from their official websites. An information sheet requesting information on organizations working for gender-responsive governance was circulated on Feminist India Group (an online group of feminists, NGOs and CSOs working on women / gender), PWDVA Action and Research Group (a Google group of individuals / group working on domestic violence and other VAW issues), and WomenPowerConnect members. Further, the sheet was circulated to the organizations initially placed in the masterlist. Refer to annexure A for information sheet for organizations.

The list of NGOs include details of contact address, phone and fax number, email ids, website along with issues NGOs work on, constituencies they work with and their area of operation. While all efforts have been made to verify the particulars provided in the lists, mistakes arising from human errors can't be ruled out.

While efforts have been taken to include all the organizations working on gender responsive governance in India, it is important to note that this is not an exhaustive list. Also, the addresses of organizations, telephone numbers, email ids and their activities are subject to change.





3. List of Research Centres and Training Institutes which work in the area of GRG (Registered Centres and Training Institutes) with their complete contact detail:

A master list of research and training organizations was created through a desk based research. The organizations on the list were then verified through telephonic interviews, wherein, their contact details (address, contact number and email id) were verified. The specifics regarding the nature of work undertaken by the research and training centres have been collated based on information available on the official website of the organization.(Annexure A)

List of the central and the state universities recognized by UGC was accessed from the official website of University Grants Commission https://www.ugc.ac.in/stateuniversity.aspx. Information about each university on the list was taken from their official website. The universities were then checked on the following parameters:

- i. Whether the research institute is ICSSR or UGC funded
- ii. Whether the institute has a set of quality Working papers or Reports which are accessible on the institute's website (usually institutes of repute will have working paper series etc)
- iii. Whether the faculty from that institute have publications in refereed journals (could be obtained from faculty profile)
- **iv.** Whether projects are going on in that institute and whether there are collaborations with reputed international organisations, central universities or well known state universities

4 & 5. Training manuals and handbooks; Working Papers, Reports and Journal Articles on GRG

Journal articles ranging from the period 1988-2018 were compiled through desk based research and visits to CWDS library in New Delhi and NIRD&PR libraryin Hyderabad. The compiled journal articles are from the following journals:
