## Need

The concept of Tribal Sub-Plan launched in the Fifth Plan aims to ensure integrated development of the various scheduled tribes/communities in the country with the aid of all pooled financial resources of the Centre and the States, keeping in view their different economic and socio-cultural backgrounds (Planning Commission, 2006). The basic objective of Tribal Sub-Plan is to channelise the flow of outlays and benefits from the general sectors in the Central Ministries/Departments for the development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes at least in proportion to their population, both in physical and financial terms.

The State Government has to initiate elaborate and appropriate Institutional mechanism to operationalize TSP (present Scheduled Tribes Component) in the State. Two Apex bodies – Nodal Agency for TSP (present Scheduled Tribes Component) and the State Tribal Welfare /Development Department have already been constituted to initialize the process of planning, allocating and approving Tribal Sub-Plan. The allocations for 2020-21 are made for (47) Departments and the remaining departments have zero allocation. The number of beneficiaries, households and area/ habitations for each scheme keeps changing due to the adding of new beneficiaries.

After independence, it was realized by policy makers that the Scheduled Tribes are still way behind the mainstream development process and the general plan schemes and programmes designed for the overall development of the economy hardly improved their socio-economic status. Similarly, the benefit of such general welfare schemes did not percolate down towards the development of STs. Population of the country in any significant manner. In order to eradicate these issues, the Tribal Sub-Plan was initiated during Fifth Five Year Plan) for socioeconomic amelioration of the tribal communities.

This training programme is intended to provide deeper knowledge and understanding about how Tribal Sub-Plans are integral part of Annual Plans as well as Five Year Plans. The TSP provisions are non-divertible and non-lapsable, with the clear objective of bridging the gap in socio-economic development of the STs within a specified period. But, the major issues and challenges are the provisions are grossly violated by the department authorities. The money earmarked for tribal development is spent in other ways making a mockery of the above objectives. There

is no monitoring and evaluation on behalf of the concerned departments and nobody is accountable for it.

## Objectives

- To sensitize the participants about the concept of Tribal Sub-plan, GPDP and convergence of these two processes.
- To examine the various aspects of TSP structure and its functions.
- To generate awareness about TSP related constitutional rights and its benefit of merging with GPDP.
