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National level Workshop on Engagement of Higher Educational Institutions in Rural Development (2 – 3 December, 2021)

A Joint Programme NIRDPR, Hyderabad & National Coordinating Institute Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, IIT-Delhi

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Background

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) aims at Higher Educational enabling Institutions (HEI) to work with the people of rural India in identifying development challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. Thus, UBA demands a connection between HEI and local communities in order to address the development challenges through appropriate technologies / management models and soon. There are several universities and science & technological institutions that already have community service as an integral component of their academic programmes. This engagement is episodic, and often one-sided in purpose.

There 45 UBA are over Regional Coordinating Institutions (RCIs) involved in guiding and monitoring the field works carried out by more than 2600 Participating Institutions (PIs). The RCIs have to remain very vibrant as a repository of project ideas; store house of information on various Government schemes and convergence possibilities; be able to handhold PIs to write effective proposals; offer operational mechanisms to ensure approved projects take off on time, and provide the required support for the PIs to really deliver the expected results. Precisely, the performance of UBA ultimately hinges on the mentoring and guidance provided by the RCIs and the field achievements of the PIs. These will unfold in a meaningful way only when RCIs recognize and understand working with rural [sociopolitical and economic] institutions and adopt certain approaches, strategies, and modes of engaging with rural communities, which this two-day programme proposes to impart.

Objectives: This workshop aims at:

- 1. Presenting the scope available for UBA Institutions to engage with community in the vicinity, and showing the scheme convergence possibilities for enabling technical competence to deliver to the needs and aspirations of rural people.
- 2. Demonstrating how to prepare effective proposals for UBA; how to mentor and monitor the PIs; and how to document the progress being made by PIs, and the students involved in UBA related field work.

Workshop Methods

There will be lots of scope for discussing specific cases, and experiences. Good practices may be shared by RCIs.

Participants: It is proposed to invite all the Regional Coordinators of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA).

Duration: This is a two-day residential programme to be held from 2.12.2021 to 3.12.2021 (Thursday & Friday)

Logistics: The training will be conducted at NIRDPR campus. It will be In-person training. The NIRDPR shall make arrangements for food, accommodation and arrangements for Airport pick up and drop of all the Participants. NIRD will not reimburse the travel expenses of the participants from their place of work to Hyderabad and back. The nominating institution has to bear the cost of travel expenses.
