

Three Day Online Workshop on EFFECTIVE RESEARCH PROPOSAL WRITING

29th November - 1st December 2021 (10.00 am to 1.00 pm - Three hours daily)

The Need

Research proposals are a quintessential guide for the execution of any research project. A well-thought-out proposal with clear scientific and technical content forms the backbone for any research asit provides a structured way to engage with the topic under study and begin reading around the area, in a systematic manner.

The present workshop is contemplated with an aim to: cover the diverse elements of Quantitative and Qualitative research proposal writing and enhance and deepen the knowledge base of the participants with the skills and tools they need to write a strong research proposal to apply for projects commissioned by NIRDPR and also to participate in competitive research study bidding process at states, and in studies commissioned by the Ministries or institutions such as NITI Aayog etc.

Objective

- 1. To provide broad guidelines to draft scientific research proposals
- 2. To provide hands on training in drafting a good research proposal

Participants

This training is offered free of charge. This is designed exclusively for the Faculty members of SIRD and ETCs from all over India. There will be some seats open for those institutions, consultants and master trainers closely working for SIRDs / ETCs.

Training Methodology

This is a 3-day online training. Each day shall have three sessions of 60 minutes duration, which includes 10 minutes of Q & A / clarifications. There will be PowerPoint Presentations made, and videos played. The participants shall be directed towards formulating a research problem, and writing a new research proposal.

Expected Outcome

The proposed workshop aims to equip the SIRD and ETC faculty in developing their skills and providing broad guidelines for writing a scientifically appropriate research proposal. In order to ensure this a format will be provided during the workshop and participants will be trained in specific aspects of a research proposal. Upon successful completion of this training, the participants should be able to write proposals seeking funding and technical support from NIRDPR, and from other institutions that promote research on rural / tribal issues.
